

Academy Governance Committee



This week, Connie Saunders, (Parent Governor) and I spent a day in school. One of the tasks we accomplished was to meet children from Year 6 with regards to their well-being. We wanted to understand and discuss the impact the Year 6 WhatsApp group, is having on them. Not all the class have access to WhatsApp. 10 children asked to meet with us and shared their concerns.

We heard from the children that the group is not a fun space. There are no ground rules. Children said members of the group are added in then thrown out weekly if not daily. They described many in the group swearing at each other.

Some of the comments included-

- "my phone is always going ding, ding, ding leave me alone."
- "I turn my phone off."
- "I leave the chat."
- "I've been accused of something I haven't done."

No-one talked about it being a fun space.

Some children said their parents checked their phones. Others said they didn't. We cannot verify this. WhatsApp is dominating conversations in and out of school, for the children, staff, Governors and for you too, if your child is engaged with this platform.

My view as a parent, is if children in Year 6 (or any other year) are using it, they are under the age of 13 and parents HAVE to monitor / act and try to make it a safer and kinder space for their child. As Governors, our view is this platform is negatively affecting their well-being.


I spoke with about 1/2 of the group the following morning after our chat. All said "chats" the previous evening had been much better after our discussion. Good to hear, but will that kinder space last...?

If your child is using WhatsApp, please can you check their phone regularly, monitor swearing, abuse etc. Can we help make it a kinder space, and / or encourage children to leave the group if the "chat" is having a negative effect on their or other children's well-being. We'd really appreciate your ongoing support with this.
